WHAT IS IT?



This year, we made a significant investment in a truly cutting-edge piece of software to support all our students in their search for the perfect job once they have finished their studies – or indeed whilst they are studying so that they can gain valuable work experience.

The NCL Careers Hub has so many resources available to all our students, that it probably warrants a whole newsletter to itself, rather than a single factsheet! We will therefore, just list some of the highlights herein:

- Do you have a CV that you would like checked? No problem, upload it to site and it will be 'read' by one of the ubiquitous CV-Readers that all major recruiters now use and will then return to you a thorough review of the CV, with recommendations for ways in which you might improve it.
- Don't have a CV? The site will take care of that too; the CV360 section will take you step by step through the process, asking you to input pertinent details, which it will then format for you and produce the CV.
- Want to hone your interview skills? There is an option on the site to undertake a mock interview with an AI Interviewer, with questions based upon the contents of your CV.
- Want training or guidance in specific areas? The site is packed with training videos and activities.
- **Everything on the site is entirely confidential, so your activities will only be reported at headline level**

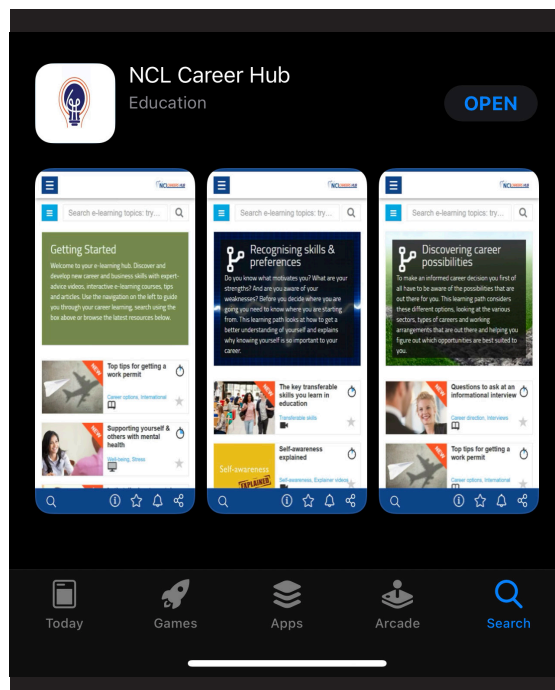
NCL CAREERS HUB APPS

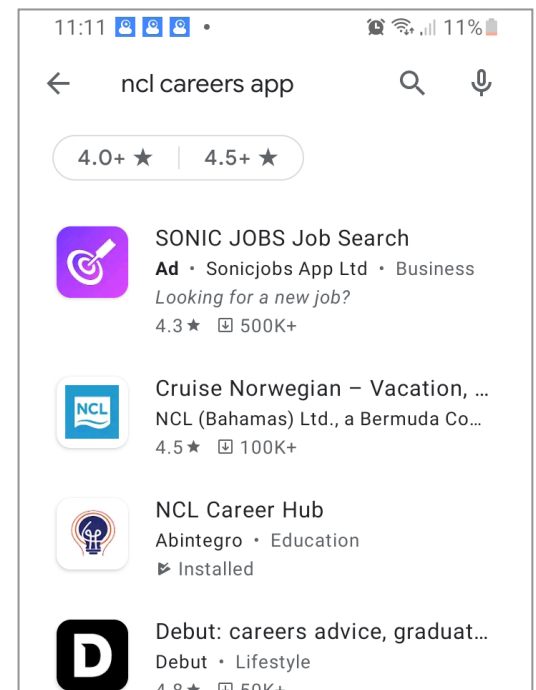
It is another perfect example of how Nelson College London really does lead the field; you will not find many colleges – or indeed universities – with apps in these app stores!

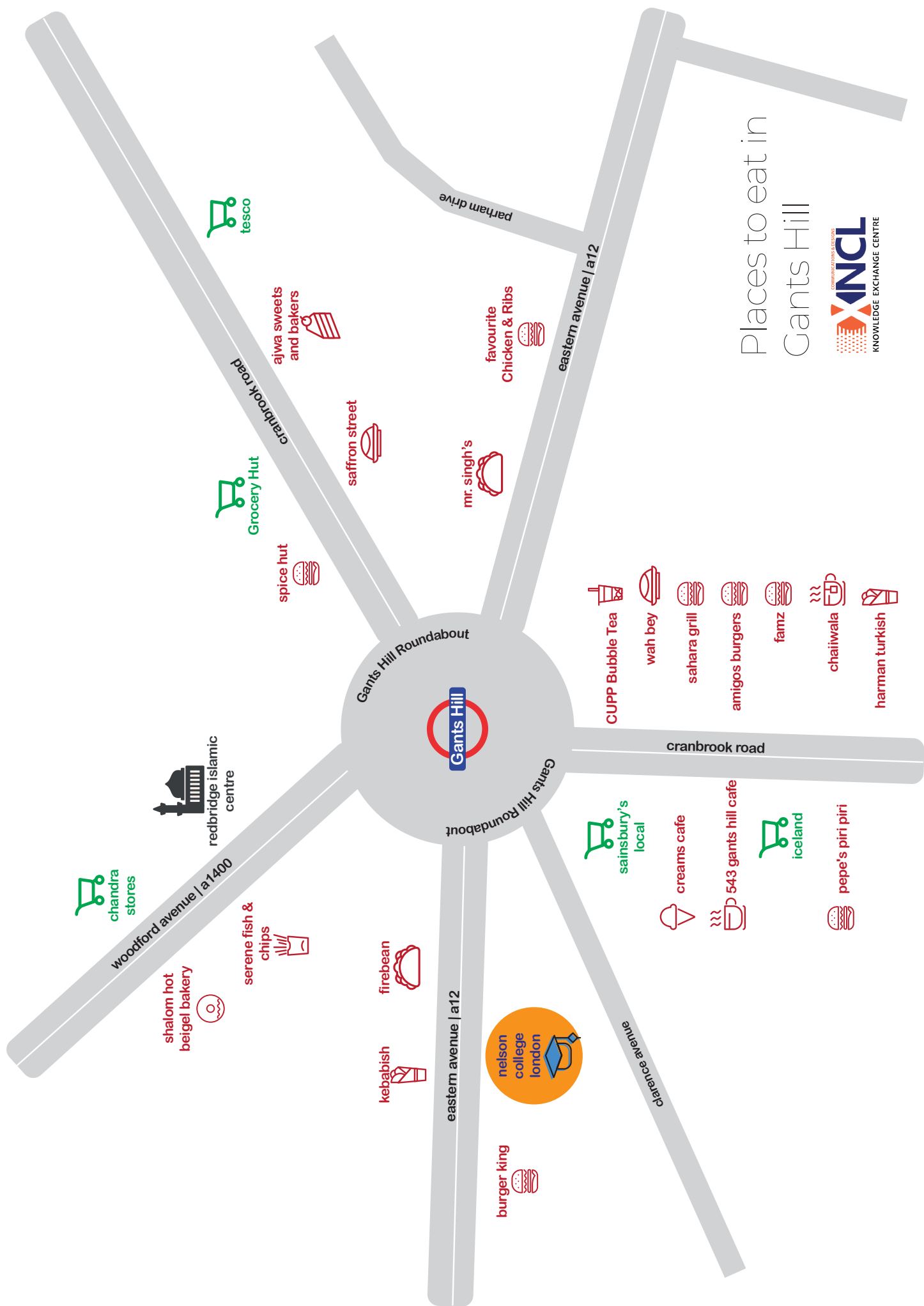

What inspired you to start your own company?

I've always been very creative. I was working in a pet shop at the time and decided to make some personalised bracelets. I bought the materials and made something I was proud of and sold them on initially just on Facebook. Then I got very busy and just kept going with it. At first, it was only supposed to be a bit of extra income on top of my regular job. Eventually, it got too much to work at the pet shop and keep up with the orders, so I was lucky enough to give up my old job and be able to focus on Velic Jewellery.

You started Velic Jewellery 6 years ago – how has the business evolved since then?

It all started with my materials in a little box. I would make lots of bespoke designs according to what people asked for. Now my materials take up a third of a room! About 2 years ago, my husband helped me to create my webpage, which has made a huge difference to my business.

Is there anything you think you could have done differently when setting up your business?

I wouldn't say I would do it differently – it has grown with demand and evolved at each step. I'm keeping up with the volume of orders and I'm happy where I am now!

What do you enjoy most about running your business?

Creating! New designs are my passion. I like to do something different and I don't like to copy. I like to make unique things that the customer will like.

You've just finished your first year of HND Business – what have you learnt about in-class that you now apply in your business procedures?

At the moment what I am benefitting from the most is the accounting side and managing my income. Although, the course has helped me in every part of my model, it helped me with managing, entrepreneurship, small business management... As a small business owner, I find it really useful because the course allows you to improve and help yourself.

What did you find to be the most challenging aspect of studying and running a business?

It takes a lot of time to study. I spend a lot of time reading and writing, so my days are very full. I work on my jewellery more in the evenings and night and study during the day. I think this is because I find it hard to study in the evening, and I was already used to working in the evenings with my jewellery.

What are your future plans for your business?

I'd like to have my business running smoothly, with team members on board. I want to be able to train them and to teach them. I also want to improve the website, my advertising and social media management.

What made you choose to study at Nelson College London?

I had two friends who studied at Nelson College London, one has already finished, and one is just finishing this year. They knew I had my own business and said I would benefit from the courses here. It also helps that the college is not too far from where I live.

What did you do prior to starting Velic Jewellery?

As I mentioned, when I first started, I was working in a pet shop. Before that, I had always worked in the Retail Industry.



What is your busiest time of year?

Just before Christmas – usually from around October to January, for the Autumn season. Summer is quite good as well.

What is the biggest barrier you come across that affects your business?

Even though we are an online company, I would actually say it was Covid. In the beginning, when everyone shifted to online shopping it was really busy. But after a while, it dropped right off. It's now starting to pick back up again.

What advice would you give to anyone thinking of starting their own business?

I think the problem is that a lot of people who start their own business give up too easily. They get bored or they want to pursue different ideas. Never give up! With any business, there are always going to be times when you want to give up. But you have to adapt and improve yourself all the time. If you stay at the same level where you started it will never work. You know like the phones? The iPhones? There are always new ones coming out! Be like an iPhone!

What advice would you give to anyone thinking of studying at Nelson College London?

I think if you are going to study, you need to take it seriously. Make time for it, put the effort in and don't leave things to the last minute. Nelson College London gives lots of opportunities, make the most of them!

I completed the HND Business as well as the BA Top Up in Business Studies. I decided to study because I had a business back in 2007 – a convenience store, but sadly, I was forced to sell it. I really wanted to learn how to do things right, I wanted to learn more.

Did you get the feeling that you were on the right path for yourself? If so, what made you think that?

Yes! I felt so good when I started studying. It has really given me so much confidence in myself. I feel that now that I am educated, I don't need to depend on anyone to do things like a business plan or balance the books.

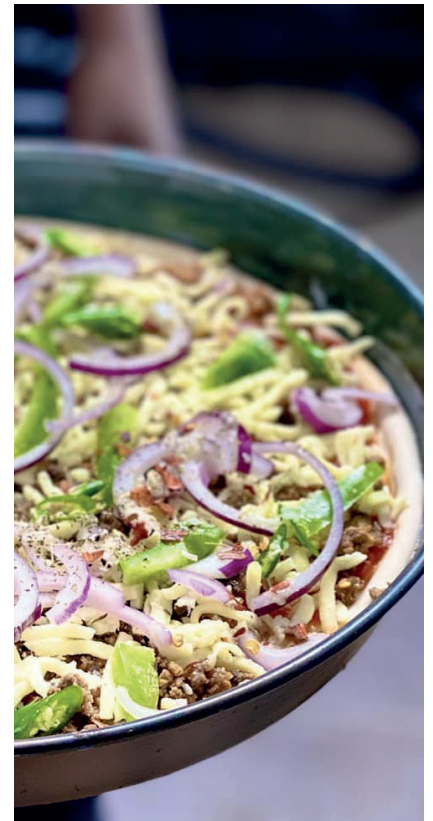


In which courses did you learn the most? Were there any courses where the subject matter was completely new to you?

I learnt the most in Business Strategy, the college was so supportive. Vishu (one of the lecturers) helped a lot.

What did you find to be the most challenging aspect of your time at Nelson College? How did you overcome this?

I struggled with presentations in front of the class – I get stage fright. I overcame this by training myself with the subject, over and over. I practiced and practiced and practiced! It was also very helpful to rely on my teammates for support as well.



A lot of people think they have to do everything by themselves – who has helped you along the way to opening Pizza Twist?

I would have to say my wife – we've been married almost 17 years and she's helped me a lot. I always wanted to be a business man and she always supports me.

How long have you been wanting to open your own restaurant and why did you want to do it?

As I said, I've always wanted to be a business man. To me, Pizza Twist is a business first, and a restaurant second.

How many people do you employ and how did you recruit them?

I currently employ 5 people at Pizza Twist and I recruited them through

personal connections in my network.

What do you look for when you hire someone?

I always look for skills, not necessarily attitude in the food business. I look at how they present the food and I learn from them. Of course, I make mistakes and I learn from them too.

People are often stuck on what to do first when starting a business, so what was the first thing you did to get the process going?

The first thing I did was to obtain a license to open the restaurant. I wouldn't have been able to open without

it, so that seemed like the first step to me. The second was money! I spent A LOT of money on this business!

Would you have done anything differently, looking back?

Not really. It was very stressful at first, though. Now I have people on board – full time employees – I am starting to relax a little!

What do you apply in your workday that you learnt at the college?

There are two kinds of things that I gained from Nelson College London – the first is skills. For example, team working skills and people management. The second, and really valuable one, is the network I gained. A lot of my fellow students were self-employed and had a variety of their own skills. I employed them and put their skills to work in my business.

What's the next step for you? What's in your future?

I want to open the next branch of Pizza Twist – somewhere out of London! Watch this space!

What advice do you have for anyone who wants to open their own business?

Simply put – everyone is human. You have to find your own passion. If you have the mentality of a businessperson and you're working for someone, you're going to feel like you're wasting your time.

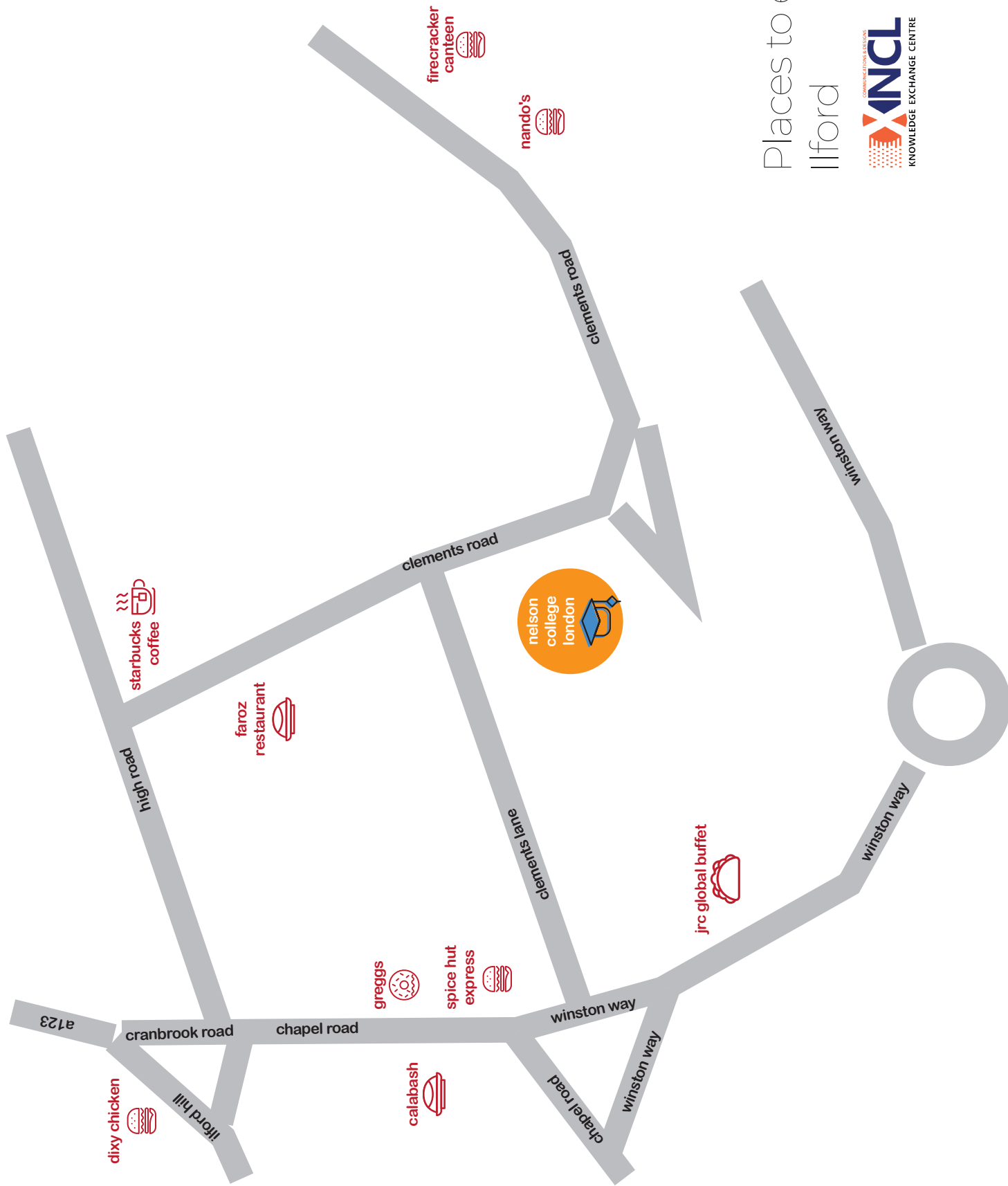

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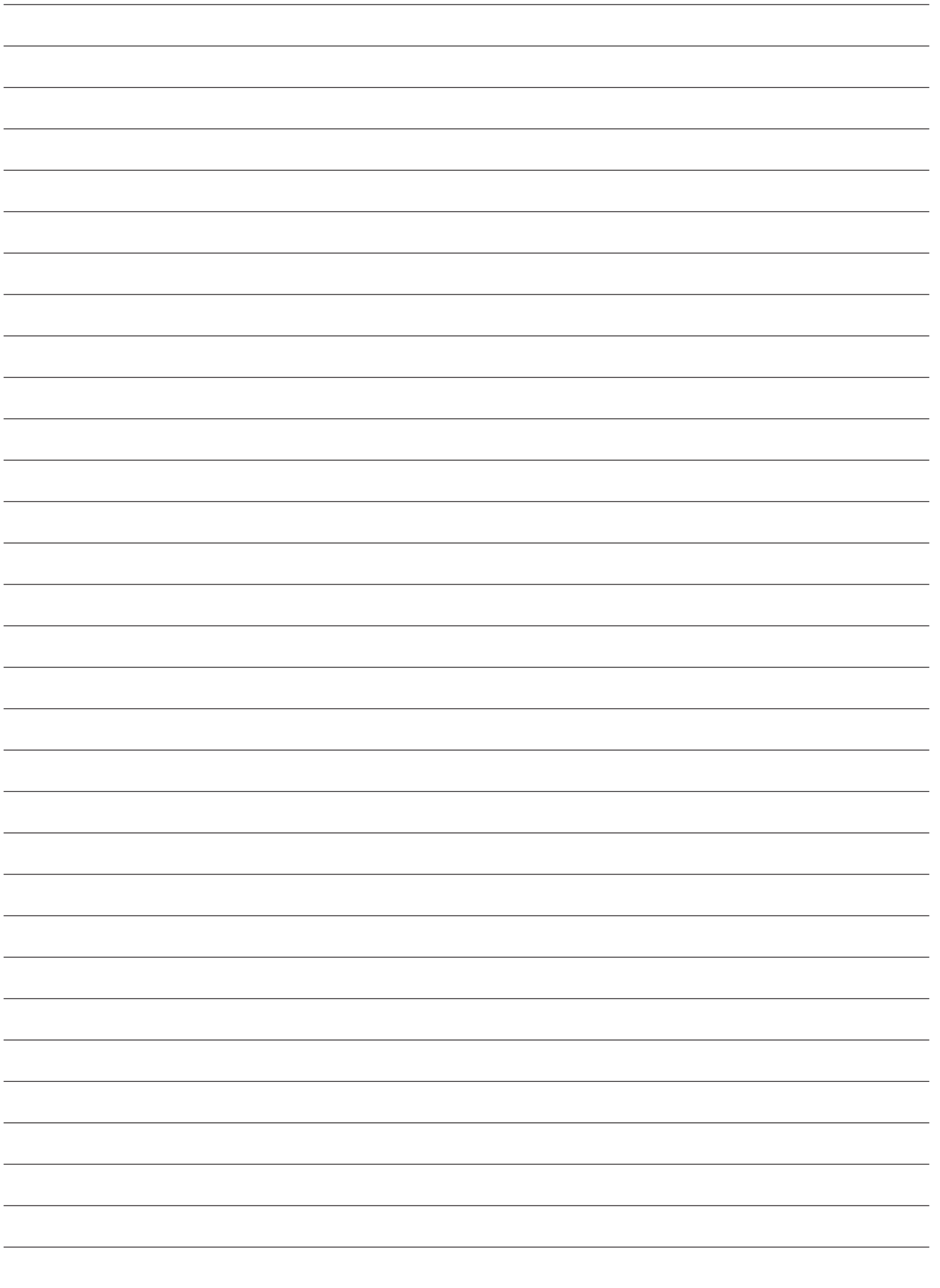
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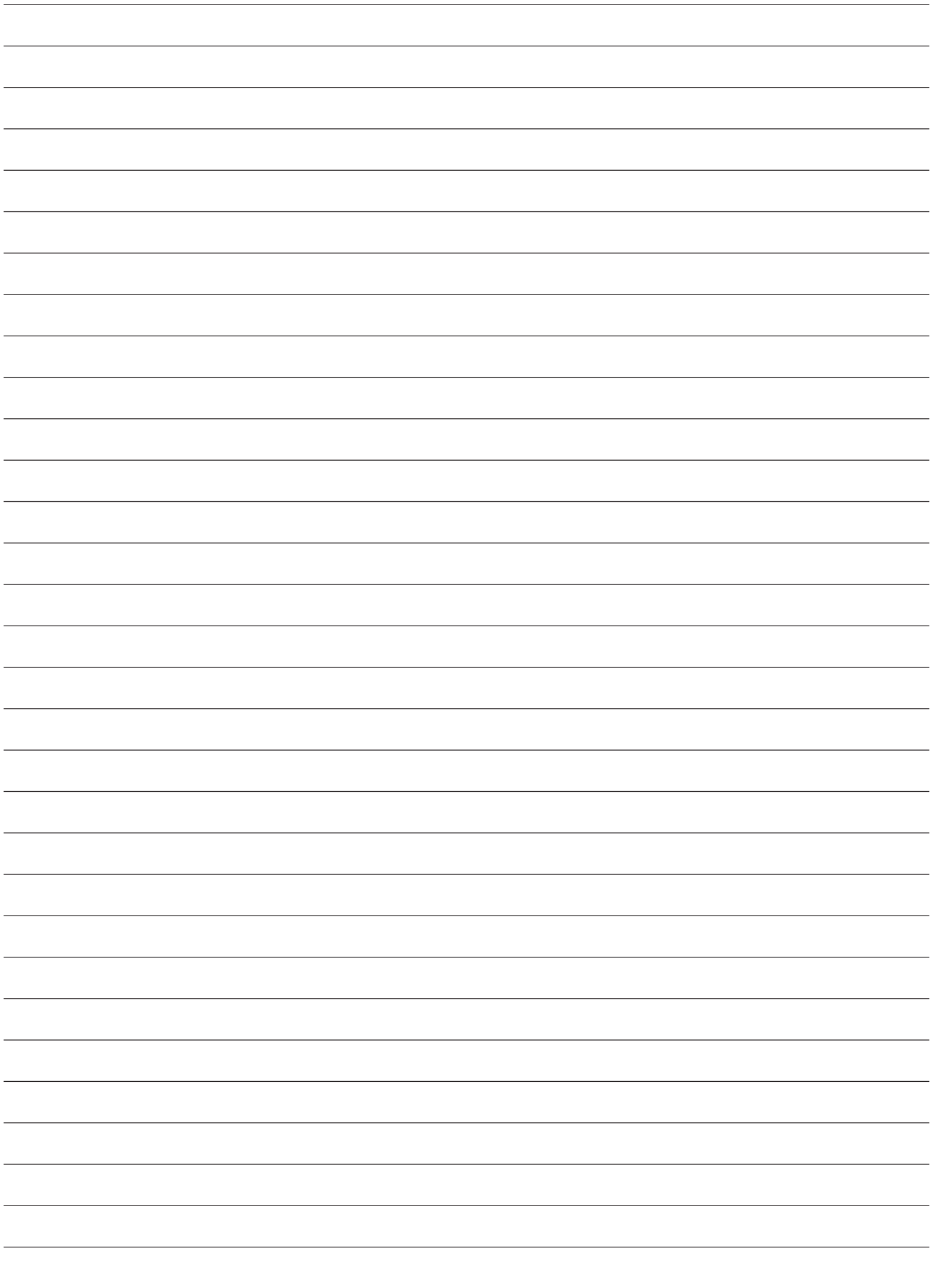
